CAG Talk on Beeleigh Abbey, Roman Circus House, Colchester -- 7:30pm

This talk is the reason that the Essex and Suffolk IVC Club Night is on next week. Colchester Archaeological Group (CAG) put these talks on every Monday evening through the winter months; they are all interesting but sometimes more than others and we really didn't want to miss this one; Janet loves the place and a couple of years ago I helped with some mapping of possible underground features and met with Mr Foyle for coffee and a very interesting tour of the house, which isn't normally open to the public. Entrance for non-members is £5 and tea, coffee and biscuits are available for a tiny fee.

Incidentally, if you haven't been here before, you can see the excellent exhibition that tells you why Roman Circus House is named as it is; and if you visit in the daytime you can walk round the marked out Roman ruins of the actual circus itself.
